

PASTOR'S CORNER by: Fr. Chris

Your words, Lord are Spirit and life, is the Psalm response from today's readings, this Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. The meaning of these words fit well with today's other readings. In Luke's Gospel, which we will be reading from primarily this year, we get an understanding for whom his original audience was. Theophilus, which literally means "friend of God." Luke's audience is his community, who are Greek speaking. This also applies to Acts of the Apostles. What Luke does, is take from the stories and writings he has about the life and teachings of Jesus and reinterprets them to fit his time and culture. Luke's writings are sometime after 80 A.D. Luke's Gospel is the only one to have an opening prologue. From there, today's gospel passage jumps to the fourth chapter where Jesus begins his public ministry by reading Isaiah in the synagogue, on the Sabbath day and the people are attentively waiting to see what it is he is going to say.

In the first reading from Nehemiah, the people have listened to what Ezra read. What Ezra read from was the book of the law of God, the Pentateuch, or what we know as the first five books of the Bible. And as we read the people found the readings, and Ezra's interpretation of them, very difficult. So Ezra and the priests then tried to lift their spirits by telling them to go and celebrate, "that rejoicing in the LORD must be their strength!"

So, now may I ask where is it that we find ourselves in this Jubilee year of Mercy? How are we celebrating it and taking advantage of it? God's words can be difficult for us to hear. Rejoicing in the LORD must be our strength also! Do we find His words to be Spirit and life?

From the Holy Father's General Audience: Wednesday, January 20, 2016



Dear Brothers and Sisters: In these days we celebrate the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. This year's theme is drawn from the First Letter of Peter, and was chosen by an ecumenical group from Latvia. In his Letter, Saint Peter encourages the first Christians to acknowledge the great gift received in Baptism and to live in a way worthy of it. He tells them: "You are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people". This Week of Prayer invites us to reflect on, and bear witness to, our unity in Christ as God's People. All the baptized, reborn to new life in Christ, are brothers and sisters, despite our divisions. Through Baptism we have been charged, as Saint Peter tells us, "to proclaim the mighty works of the one who has called us out of darkness into his marvellous light". During this Week of Prayer, let us ask the Lord to help all Christians to grow in that unity which is greater than what divides us. 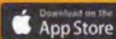
