PASTOR'S CORNER by: Fr. Chris

In today's readings from Jeremiah and the Gospel of Luke, we are given the chance to look at two prophetic ministries. The two prophets, Jesus and Jeremiah both encounter opposition and a lack of faith and have a mission. We see right away what that mission is for Jeremiah. He is to be a prophet to the nations and the LORD is going to strengthen him for this task.

In the Gospel, Jesus is in the synagogue and has just finished reading from Isaiah, and everyone is amazed at what He has said. It is at this point that things begin to turn. Jesus begins to address the people in the synagogue about His mission and their pleasure about Him begins to unravel. This is not what the people had in mind. The people know who He is and they can sense that great things were about to happen in their community. They know about His notoriety and the benefits that could come from Jesus' popularity in their community. However, Jesus goes on to tell them that He is not going to be a prophet just for them, but that He is also going out to the surrounding nations. And as we read, the people in the synagogue are not happy about it.

The question we need to ask our selves is how we handle it if and when we see others receiving God's grace? Do we rejoice or do we get angry about it? This story lets us know that we are called to learn how to cooperate with grace, and rejoice wherever we find God's grace working. If we look for it, grace can always be found, even when it is given out to the "other nations." The difficult thing for us is to not fall into the trap of resentment like the people in the synagogue. But too often, like them, we wish to keep it for ourselves and we fall into the trap of resentment. Another way of putting it is, we fall into the trap of "what is in it for me?"

From the Holy Father's General Audience: 1/27/16

Dear Brothers and Sisters:
Continuing our weekly catechesis inspired by this Holy Year devoted to divine mercy, we now consider

God's mercy at work in the history of the Chosen People. The Scriptures show the Lord's merciful concern for Israel throughout its history, beginning with the call of Abraham. God's mercy is expressed particularly, however, in the experience of the exodus from Egypt. God heard the cry of his people, as he hears the cry of the poor and oppressed in every age. He raised up Moses to be the mediator of his mercy and salvation. Through Moses, he led Israel to freedom and, through the covenant, he made them his own possession, "a kingdom of priests and a holy nation" (Ex 19:5-6), a people precious in his eyes. The mystery of God's mercy culminates in the sending of his Son, the Lord Jesus, in that "new and eternal covenant" inaugurated in his blood, whereby we are granted the forgiveness of our sins and become truly God's children, beloved sons and daughters of our good and merciful Father.

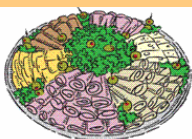

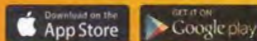
