PASTOR'S CORNER by: Fr. Chris

This weekend we celebrate the greatest gift we have been given, The Resurrection. If it were not for the resurrection our faith would be in vain. It is because Jesus rose from the dead in his glorified body that we have hope in eternal life. However, is the resurrection all which we celebrate this weekend? Hardly.

If we remember from last week's article, we had looked at the Triduum as one long liturgy from Holy Thursday through the Easter Vigil.

Yet, notice what takes place at the Easter Vigil. The Holy Oils which were consecrated by our Bishop at the Chrism Mass, are used for the first time publicly for bringing, and for further deepening, people into the mystery of Jesus Christ and His life into His body the Church. The Baptismal font and water are blessed and, when we are privileged, new members are bathed into these waters. Perhaps you have noticed just how special this blessing of the font and water is on this evening. The deacon takes the Easter candle during the blessing and submerges it three times into the water. The Easter Candle which was just blessed, represents Jesus Christ, the light who has come into the world, and the font, his bride, the Church who brings forth new life. However, during this whole Vigil, have we celebrated Jesus Christ Risen?

We are actually with Jesus in His death are we not? He does not rise till early morning; we rather keep vigil this evening and as the Missal says it is the greatest and most noble of all solemnities. It includes after the Luminaries, the Easter Proclamation, meditation on the wonders of God's creation, trusting in His word and promises, to welcoming new members reborn in Baptism. And lastly the table of the Lord is prepared for His people, the memorial of His Death and Resurrection until He comes again. And for the Resurrection on Sunday, we celebrate for fifty days; the first eight days are celebrated as solemnities. Have a wonderful Easter everyone.

From the Holy Father's General Audience: From March 12, 2016

Dear Brothers and Sisters: As we draw near to Easter in this Holy Year of Divine Mercy, we reflect today on the Lord's gesture of washing the feet of his disciples. In this striking act of humility, Jesus tells them, and us, to do the same for one another. He gave us a clear example of his new commandment of love. As Saint John says, just as he laid down his life for us, so we ought to lay down our lives for one another (cf. 1 Jn 3:16). Jesus shows us that love is service – lowly, quiet and hidden – of our brothers and sisters, especially those in greatest need. By bending low to wash his disciples' feet, Jesus also invites us to acknowledge our failings, to pray for one another and to forgive each other from the heart. He shows us that to be "merciful like the Father" means to follow Jesus daily along the path of humble service.
