PASTOR'S CORNER by: Fr. Chris

Fifth Sunday of Easter

Wow, it is almost surprising how fast and far we have come into the Easter Season. What may come as another surprise is how the Gospel for today leads us back to the beginning for the preparation for Easter. In our Gospel for today, John, the author, has Jesus giving us his introduction to his final discourse. This is no ordinary introduction though; it is the beginning of his farewell discourse at the Last Supper which concludes with his famous prayer in Chapter 17. The Gospel for today is also another short gospel passage with only a few verses. This does not mean it has no less importance though.

I am reminded of this after some events which took place the night before I sat down to write this reflection. Last night as we had finished up Mass, I had concelebrated Mass with Fr. Balla in Spooner. So after Mass, we were talking with some of his parishioners and some friends I've known for quite some time. Fr. Balla was asked to hear some confessions, and I had just unvested when suddenly I was called to come quickly outside - someone needed me. It was a friend to whom we had just been speaking. She had fallen and appeared to be having a stroke. I quickly anointed her because of the pace of things happening. Both the hospital and the emergency responders were only a couple of blocks away. The other thing I know is that when this person asked for me, she was not actually asking for me, she wanted Jesus because "the Son of Man has been glorified and God has been glorified in him."

Today's Gospel we have Jesus' introduction to his last Discourse with his disciples where he says, "My children, I will only be with you only a little while longer." Unfortunately, but also fortunately, from the information I received, my friend is not expected to be around here much longer. Yet, though she has had a love for God, most all of her life, I also know that like in our first reading, life has not always been easy, and she has had to persevere in the faith. However, if she does go, what a way to go, just after being at the Lord's Supper and being anointed. May we also be as lucky to be prepared, as the Lord is preparing his disciples in our gospel for today. And may we be like all of the souls of the faithful departed, who rest in God's Peace, as in the prayer Jesus offers, which ends his last discourse.

From the Holy Father's General Audience: April 20, 2016

Dear Brothers and Sisters: In our continuing catechesis for this Holy Year of Mercy, we now consider the Gospel episode of Jesus' dinner at the home of Simon the Pharisee. Saint Luke tells us that a woman known as a sinner came up to Jesus, bathed his feet in her tears and anointed them with precious perfume. The Pharisee, judging by appearances, is taken aback that Jesus is not afraid of contact with sinners. The Lord distinguishes between the sin and the sinner. He teaches Simon that the woman's act, as an expression of faith and trust in God's mercy has merited the forgiveness of her sins. The story of the sinful woman reminds us that God's mercy reaches out to everyone; it overcomes prejudice and surmounts all barriers. Through faith in Christ, we too have received the forgiveness of our sins and the new life of grace. Having experienced this mystery of redeeming love, may we grow in gratitude for so great a gift, and in turn become witnesses and channels of that love in our families, our communities and our world.

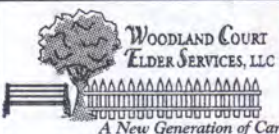
