PASTOR'S CORNER by: Fr. Chris

Well, here we are again at the end of fifty days of celebrating Easter. In the early Church the whole period of time was known as Pentecost. It was a time of celebration, no fasting was allowed, prayer was done standing, and the Alleluia was said more often. This period of time ran from Easter to Pentecost Sunday. Even for the Church today, this Solemnity ranks right up there with Easter, and Christmas. Yet this Sunday is so closely related to The Ascension where we heard last Sunday Jesus told the apostles "to wait in the city, and to be clothed with the power from on high." Yet I find it an interesting thought, how Jesus ascends into heaven. However, heaven and earth is not two separate places. This is a trap that many in the early church fell into and is still on the minds of some today. That is, there is a separation between heaven and earth and they are two distinct places.

There are three different readings for feast day, all from the Gospel of John. All three of these readings speak of the Holy Spirit. In the reading from John, Chapter 7, it is "Rivers of Living water which will flow from those who believe," and as the passage relates, it is a reference to the Spirit. In John Chapter 2, it is "the Father's Peace received from Jesus breathing the Holy Spirit upon the disciples." Lastly in John, Chapter 14, the Father sends the Advocate, the Holy Spirit in Jesus' name. All three readings are three ways of expressing today's Solemnity of the Holy Spirit. They express how our God, in heaven, interacts with us on earth. Heaven is never separated from us, but it is, how open we are to it. It is this Holy Spirit which teaches each of us everything which Jesus has told us. That is something each of us can celebrate over.

From the Holy Father's General Audience: May 11, 2016

Dear Brothers and Sisters: In our continuing catechesis for this Holy Year of Mercy, we now turn to Jesus' parable of the merciful father who welcomes back his prodigal son with unconditional love and forgiveness. Jesus wishes to teach us that we are children of God not because of any merits of our own but because of the infinite love of our heavenly Father. How often do we need to be reminded of God's unchanging love and ready forgiveness, lest we lose heart when we ourselves or our dear ones go astray! The parable speaks not only of the prodigal son, but also of his older brother, who must also learn to accept the father's mercy, which transcends both reward and punishment. By calling for a feast of thanksgiving, the father is really asking each son to share his joy by recognizing the other as a brother. The parable ends without our knowing how the older brother responds to this invitation. Jesus in effect is challenging each of us to think about how we respond to God's invitation, to open our hearts to his reconciling love and to become "merciful like the Father".

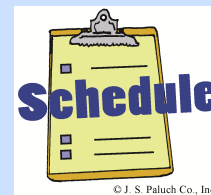

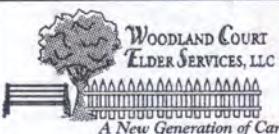
