

PASTOR'S CORNER by: Fr. Chris

Vanity of vanities! All things are vanity! This famous saying comes in the first sentence of our first reading for today. Qoheleth, the reputed author for our first reading from The Book of Ecclesiastes. Scholars are still not quite sure who he was. But what we do know is that

whoever this person was, he was old, evidentially quite well off, and was well known and well educated in many areas for his place in time. The book is believed to have been written sometime in the third century B. C. And in this writing, this person Qoheleth is giving evidence of how he has looked back over his life and is asking the big questions: What is this toil in life all about? Why work for wisdom, knowledge, skill, and prosperity when in the end, someone else will get it?

In the gospel passage, Jesus is asked to be an arbitrator. However, have you ever noticed how Jesus does not give a direct answer to what the person wants; especially when it involves the person asking Jesus to do something which the person feels will benefit his self-interest? Rather, what Jesus does, is to let the person know what will actually benefit the person. And in this case, Jesus tells the parable about the rich man who wished to hang on to all the possessions he had. One thing should be noted, God does not have anything against wealth and it being a part of one's life, according to one's state in life. Notice though what this wealthy man did, he was hanging on to all of what he had by building bigger barns. He had more than what he could use. Rather than hanging on to all the produce for himself, he should have shared at least the excess with others. What he was doing was idolizing himself, look at all I have, now I can eat, drink, and be merry. Jesus, was trying to get across to this person in today's story, that there are more important things than what he was hanging on to; he had more than what he actually needed.

Our author from Ecclesiastes was also realizing the importance of this, that it is not a matter of reaching for and obtaining all which one can have in the world, when it is done for one's self-aggrandizement. In the end, will not someone else end up with it? Besides, was it not God who allowed the attainment of everything we have? In closing, perhaps what we had better be asking ourselves is, what is it that God wants for me to keep for my state in life and what am I being called to share with others?
