PASTOR'S CORNER by: Fr. Chris

A few weeks ago, in our gospel reading we had the story about Martha and Mary. In this story, we seen how Jesus was not concerned with what was culturally correct (Mary was in the room with a man, and was sitting at his feet), as he was with those who were there hearing what was truly important. Then the following Sunday we listened to Jesus teach the disciples how to pray in relation to the Father, and he gave an example of how to be persistent in prayer. Last week, there was the story of a rich man who wished to hang on to all of his possessions, and so he built bigger barns and when completed and full, he felt that he was set in life. However, that same gospel ended with "being rich in what matters to God."

This week, our Gospel begins with a famous quote St. John Paul II, "Do not be afraid." Yet the same passage continues with "any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom." Is there anything greater? Of course the answer is no, there is nothing greater being able to acquire the kingdom! And as the disciples learned from this Sunday's parable, this whole reading is meant for everyone. No one is excluded. Yet, most-often the conversion experience does not happen overnight. It is a process and God knows this because he also knows the human heart. Most often it is not instantaneous in changing. It takes grace and most often time for the human heart to change. And thankfully, God is patient and yet he is also just when we do not ask and cooperate with His grace.

Eucharistic Adoration *Got Stress.....Get Peace! (Part 2)*



Last week we listed some things in our lives that cause us stress. Here are some small steps that will help us find peace.

- Implement at least 15 minutes of meditative prayer in your day. Spend time in quiet reflection and prayer so you can simply be with Jesus and take a time-out from your hectic day. Numerous studies show a tremendous impact on anxiety when a person has regular meditation each day. It may help to read from Scripture or a spiritual book to help you get started.

- Pray Instantly when anxiety begins to creep in. A short prayer will suffice. (“God Help Me!,” for example.)

- Make a commitment to celebrate the sacraments at least a little more than you do now, and try to commit to doing more Eucharistic Adoration too. Nothing less than Christ's grace can help us achieve the peace that will make us saints..”

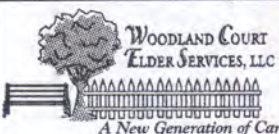
