PASTOR'S CORNER by: Fr. Chris

This week, I offer some things to reflect upon, in this season of preparation. We have in our Gospel, John asking if Jesus is the one who is to come? John asks this question because even from his prison cell, he has heard the great works which Jesus has performed. However, reflect on

what John's situation was really like and why he would ask this question. John is in prison, it is not a very pleasant place at any time. In his time, when someone was incarcerated, they were brought to a cell, which was more like a cistern, and lowered down into it by a rope. It had to be cold and damp and full of refuse from yourself and the others who had been in there before you. There was no place to rest comfortably. And to think, this is all happening to John after he had lived a life of austerity in the desert.

In our reading from First Isaiah, Isaiah is having the people look forward to the vindication of Zion by the defeat of their enemies. They have been through tough times and have been in conflict with and overthrown by other nations. Isaiah is looking forward to better and holier times; so he says, "The desert will bloom with abundant flowers, there will be joyful song, and will see the glory of the LORD, the splendor of our God... Those whom the LORD has ransomed will return and enter Zion singing, crowned with everlasting joy."

So what can we take from these readings on this third Sunday of advent? To look forward to our God! In both of our readings, our prophets have seen "God's Face." And they continue to strive forward for what is prepared for them. Yet it is good to remember that, sometimes in life, we think when things are going good for us, that we have a life which is often called a 'good life'. And when things are not going so good for us, it can be a life of not much worth. It can be easily lost in the sight of what is truly important in either situation. That is, of Him who has come, for us and that same one who is to come again. It is for us to remember that He comes with "divine recompense in His first coming to save you." And in His Second Coming, Jesus tells us that even those who are least in the kingdom of heaven will be greater than John the Baptist as he lived out his life preparing for the coming of the LORD.

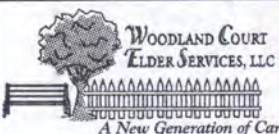
